VHR history

The barque Free Trader parted from both of its main anchors during a sudden gale at Warrnambool. The remaining anchor dragged, and the vessel drifted towards the beach, going broadside onto the piling at the swimming baths. The piling soon battered a hole through the hull, and the vessel filled with water. The crew

escaped by climbing onto the piling, but the Free Trader became a total wreck.
