VHR history

On a voyage from Newcastle to Melbourne loaded with coal, the barque Fury was run ashore at the north point of Sealer's Cove, Wilsons Promontory and became a total wreck. The mate and four hands sailed to Port Albert, from where the harbour-masters schooner set sail to relieve the captain, his family and the remainder of the men who were left in temporary tents at Sealers Cove. The vessel's master was found guilty of culpable negligence for the loss.
