While riding out a gale in Refuge Cove, the anchor chain of the brig Gertrude began to cut through the hull, such was the strength of the wind and the strain on the anchor. With the ship leaking badly, the captain let the Gertrude drift ashore, where it struck rocks and sank. All on board reached safety.
