Driven ashore on Gabo Island while sheltering from a storm

### **VHR** history

Previously wrecked Blythe River, Emu Bay, Tasmania, August 21, 1882, but salvaged. Some doubts over the date of wrecking. Both Loney and Parsons indicate that the vessel was wrecked on or about the 1st June 1882. However, the Australasian Shipping News reported the wrecking as occurring in June 1881. The only mention of a schooner called GIPPSLANDER in the papers reports a safe voyage from Mallacoota Inlet to Melbourne in May/June 1882.
