## **VHR history**

Register closed 18 July 1862. No other details of wrecking located. During early 1840s traded between Geelong, Melbourne, Port Albert, Twofold Bay. Carried passengers, bricks and sundries to Port Albert, returning with oysters. Later in decade carried wool (for transshipment), bark and tallow from Geelong to Melbourne, returning with timber, gum logs, posts for wool press, sundries. Research (selective only) indicates it was trading in the Bay and docking in the Yarra in 1857 and 1859. One-time lime carrier.
