br /> Gabo Island and Wilsons Promontory. The vessel vanished at sea, Benzine

br /> cases wee washed up on the New South Wales coast and the tern of a ships

br /> boat was found on King Island. The government schooner Dart was sent out

br /> to look for the vessel at the end of October 1918 and found wreckage

br /> over a wide area.
