The schooner HARRIET left Geelong on November 14, 1848 bound for Hobart and was last sighted off Cape Schank. In 1849 The Geelong Advertiser carried an article in which it was stated that the vessel was believed to be lost in Bass Strait and that the widow of the First Mate was now destitute. The article appealed for money and clothing.
