## **VHR** history

The Hillsmeads, a wooden twin screw vessel of 214 tons built at Jervis Bay in 1907 for the Illawarra and South Coat Steam navigation Co. was purchased in March 1918 and registered at Launceston by W.A. Pilbeam Co. Ltd. and for about ten years plied in the North west coast Melbourne timber trade. In December 1923 the Hillsmeads towed the schooner Coomondery from Launceston to Melbourne. The schooner has been ashore at Emu Bay and after refloating had had temporary repairs carried out at Launceston before being towed to Melbourne.
