VHR history

Bring Jane, Captain Thrussel arrived on Tuesday to take on cargo of potatoes. Due to heavy rolling sea had just commenced loading and at the time of the wreck had taken on board 1/2 dozen tons on board. 2pm parted cable but held until night when other cable parted and vessel came on shore. Crew tried to return as she drifted shoreward of by Captain Helpman and the harbourmasters boat's however before reaching the vessel the HM boat struck by sea and capsized. 1 person lost, vessel expected to be total wreck. Body not recovered.
 The court of inquiry found Captain Thrussell guilty of negligence in that he left Melbourne knowing his anchor cables were defective, but as he did not hold a masters certificate no action could be taken.
