## **VHR** history

The John Bull was an old Tasmanian built ship that was Originally rigged as a schooner and owned by J. Bellion, pilot, of Launceston. Came to Melbourne in 1850, carrying palings. In 1850s made voyages between Melbourne and Geelong and in the Bay. In 1886, the John Bull was sunk in ballast in the high winds at the Ann St. Pier, Williamstown. Registry closed 1891.
