Cause of loss

Sandridge

Beached in a sinking condition as pumps were not coping with the leaking ship. The water gained rapidly when the pumps choked so the master decided to beach the vessel. However she floundered when about twenty miles from her destination.

VHR history

The schooner Julius was damaged in a gale and began to take water. After the pumps failed, the vessel was run ashore on the Ninety Mile Beach in an attempt to save the lives of those on board. However, the captain and cook were drowned.
