VHR history

The John was on a passage to the Heads with provisions (Port Phillip Herald 1846), when it was driven from anchorage off Mount Eliza, drifted between two rocks, and under the onslaught of weather became a total wreck. The captain and one crew member narrowly escaped with their lives. The vessel had been purchased by R.J. Howard from A.F.A. and G.P.A. Greeves only a few weeks earlier.
