#### VHR history

The Lady Flora's register was closed 31 Dec. 1854 with the notation: 'Lost Hobsons Bay 1854. However, the vessel was still sailing until 16 Dec 1854, when it arrived at Geelong from Melbourne and possibly sailed again for Melbourne. In 1850 it carried palings from Circular Head to Adelaide, and sailed from Circular Head to Melbourne carrying beer sherry, and flour. In 1852 it carried 21 passengers and sundries on one voyage from Adelaide to Melbourne. In 1853-4 it brought transhipments and sundry free goods from Melbourne to Geelong, and was usually in ballast returning to Melbourne.
