The vessel was laid up at anchor in the bay when she dragged and finally broke her chains at about 3.00pm and collided with South Melbourne Baths striking the north side first stern first then swung around through the western wall and demolished the other side. and was returned to service for a time before being scuttled.

VHR history

After colliding with the South Melbourne Baths on 17 Dec 1926,she was
 put back into service but was soon withdrawn again and scuttled. Vessel
 was formerly called ANTILLA. Engines from EXCELSIOR, circa 1919. 4
 Bulkheads cemented, 1 deck, water ballast. Engines: Q.4 Cy15",
 21", 31" & amp; 43" - 30", 101 NHP. Built under
 Specia Survey. Schooner Rigged, elliptical stern, clincher built.
