VHR history

Laden with coal from Newcastle, the schooner Margaret Nicol was damaged in a severe gale. The vessel was leaking and unmanageable, so the master sought shelter at Gabo Island. The Margaret Nicol was anchored under the lee of the island, but sank soon afterwards. Crew rescued off the island by SS Wonga Wonga after two days.
