### **VHR** history

There was a fearful heavy sea running from the east the vessel was hauled upon the wind and everything tried to give her an offing. 1.30 am on the 16th saw breakers on the lee side about half a cable length tried to stay her, she missed, let go port bower anchor but before giving chain the vessel struck on a bar of rocks on which she thumped and rolled on the bar for 12 minutes, the sea coming right over her washing booms etc overboard when she was swept clean to the beach the sea continuing washing over her. All the crew reached safety.<br/>
Previously 'wrecked', 30 Aug. 1862, Duck River, Tasmania, but salvaged. Often incorrectly referred to as Mimmie Dyke.
