Originally built by the Public Works Department in South Australia, most likely for the South Australian Colonial Government. Vessel was first stranded on 14 August 1948 at Victor Harbour in South Australia. Vessel was salvaged and rebuilt using same numbers. Register closed in March 1962, marked 'Wrecked at Lady Julia Percy Island, Victoria'.
