Vessel lost sternway rounding eastern reef at entrance to Port Campbell, and swell forced the vessel onto rocks on western shore of Port Campbell harbour

Statement of significance

<p>The SS Napier is significant as a wreck associated with the wreck of the Loch Ard, and to Port Campbell's history and development as a port. It demonstrates the risks involved in salvage and using the rudimentary port facilities of Victoria's West Coast.</p>

VHR history

The Napier was being contracted to undertake salvage on the wreck of the Loch Ard. While returning to Port Campbell it lost sternway while rounding the eastern reef and bluff, and swell forced it onto rocks on the western side of the cove.
