The schooner Neptune, carrying a cargo of dynamite from Melbourne to Sydney, went ashore near Pearl Point on the Ninety Mile Beach. The vessel became a total wreck and the cargo was blown up on the beach. The Marine Board of Victoria suspended the captain's certificate for two years for careless navigation. The mate's certificate was suspended for twelve months.
