## **VHR** history

Went ashore about the same time as the Jim grounded, as well as another unnamed vessel, a water carrier [almost certainly Sea Flower]. Sailed between Geelong and Westernport in 1857, 1859; owner and master F. Maule. In1869 McNeven stood trial on charge of feloniously scuttling Novelty near Indented Head, with intention of defrauding Hobart Town and Launceston Marine Insurance Co. It was alleged he had punched holes in the boat using a marlinspike (UID 9)At Melbourne Criminal Court jury found him not guilty (UID 152).
