VHR history

The schooner Paul Pry was struck by a squall off Cape Schank and laid over onto its side. The crew attempted to right the ship by cutting away the masts, but the hull began to fill with water. The passengers and crew abandoned ship as the schooner began to sink. All reached safety except one of the passengers who drowned
