VHR history

Following a collision with another vessel and striking the bar at the Gippsland Lakes, the steamer Pretty Jane was proceeding to Melbourne for repairs. However, when off the Ninety Mile Beach, the vessel began to sink and was beached. All on board were saved but the Pretty Jane broke up.
