VHR history

The barque Result left Newcastle bound for Geelong with 1100 tons of coal on 26 September 1880. The vessel was sighted as it entered Bass Strait, but then disappeared without a trace. The Victorian government sloop Victoria searched Bass Strait and the islands but without success. At the time, it was suggested that as the

vessel was thoroughly seaworthy, it was unlikely to have foundered at sea. Instead it may have gone ashore somewhere in the strait. However, no trace of the Result was ever found. Seventeen lives were lost.
