VHR history

After vessel broke up, cargo floated in all directions. Traded between Geelong, Heads and Hobsons Bay in 1850s and 1860s. A lime carrier in 1858, wool, general cargo and ballast in 1860s. Other vessels wrongly reported to have been wrecked in same storm. Register closed 31 Oct. 1866. A number of earlier owners. During 1840s traded between Hobart, Melbourne, Adelaide, Sydney, Circular Head, Port Fairy, Port Albert in 1850s and 1860s between Melbourne and Geelong
