### VHR history

Shark boat. Experienced fishermen concluded that the boat came inshore owing to the rough weather, approaching too close to the reef and stove in its side. It was believed that the boat then drifted out into the tideway where it sank. Queenscliff fishermen expressed concern that no lifeboat was available when the Robert John was seen foundering off Point Nepean by the lighthouse keeper at Point Lonsdale. The lifeboat had been taken to Melbourne for overhaul and survey 'many months' earlier and had not returned. In the interval, no other suitable rescue boat was available. Loney claims erroneously that 3 drowned. An appeal in Queenscliff raised 200 pounds for families of the 2 victims.
