Loaded with coal, the brig Straun sprang a leak off the Gippsland coast. With six feet of water in the hold and the water gaining on the pumps, the crew abandoned ship and were rescued by the schooner Gem. The Gem stood by until the Straun sank and then took the crew on to Melbourne.
