## VHR history

Experienced fishermen at Port Fairy were reported to have advised against the trip. Rigged as a yacht. Driven past Channel while approaching Heads. Skipper mistook warning beacon set midway along Nepean Reef for end of Rock. At 4 am, struck south side of Reef and bumped 20 yards across to north side, settling in 15 ft of water. Crew lashed oil drums together to make an improvised raft but it was smashed by the waves about 50 yards from the beach. One man survived, making his way to Fort Nepean. Port and Harbors launch searched without success for the other three. One body was recovered 5 days later. A headless body, believed to be that of Reid, was washed upon Point Nepean Back Beach, about a month later.
