VHR history

The steam launch VIXEN sprang a leak while being towed by the Howard Smith Ltd tugboat SPRIGHTLY. An attempt was made to beach the vessel at Rhyll but it foundered about one mile east of the Cowes Jetty. No lives were lost. The Vixen was being towed to Melbourne for overhauling and repainting. The registry is marked: Registry closed 06.08.1917, vessel was lost about 1 mile out from Cowes Jetty on 20.07.1917 in 9 fathoms of water and is a total wreck.
