The bayside ketch came ashore during a storm. Register closed 31 December 1875. Mortgagee - Henry Alfred Coffey, auctioneer, of Melbourne, 27 March 1874. Loney states that the ketch was lost in Corio Bay - this appears to be incorrect.<br /> <br /> Further evidence suggests that the ship was lost off Ricketts Point.
