VHR history

The Western Port trader Wasp dragged its anchors during a gale, and was driven onto rocks near Corinella, Western Port . The cargo was very much damaged. The Mate A . Ellis broke his arm. Very little is known about this vessel - only one vessel called WASP is recorded by A.S.R.O.as registered at Melbourne during this period - WASP, official number 48422, wrecked, Port Phillip, October 1875. t is quite possible that this is the same vessel, wrecked, refloated, repaired and wrecked again 12 years later.
