# VHR history

This site was reported to the M.A.U. in 1984 by Peter Taylor of the M.A.A.V. The remains are those of a small wooden vessel, possibly Australian built with some connection with Victoria's military past. A ship's bell, silver button, glass bottle, stoneware bottle and pulley block are held by Mr Taylor. The site is marked on a Pre-1864 chart of Hobsons Bay, surveyed in 1864. This site was inspected by Mr Clark and Mr Jackiw of the M.A.U. some time in 1986. However the area was then covered with sand. Subsequent visits to the site in May 1989 and May 1990 also found the site covered with sand.
