# **VHR** history

Sports divers inspecting the wreck of the Queenscliffe in 1970 found it resting on an unknown wreck.<br/>
This may be the wreck of the Isabel B, a motor launch which was lost in a storm while moored to the jetty during the evening of 5 April 1919, and found to be wrecked on the morning of 6/5/1919. The launch belonged to the Central Flying School. All serviceable parts including the engine are recorded to have been removed from the wreck.
