### **VHR** history

The schooner Corinthian was taken out into Port Phillip from Rye in preparation for a storm, however it sprang a leak and washed onto a sandbank about 600 yards from the beach.<br/>
| After attempting to swim ashore in the heavy seas all four men returned to the schooner, and were rescued by Joseph Culliver, 18 years, and Douglas Culliver 16 years, fishermen of Rye.<br/>
| The schooner was described as a total wreck. (Argus 27 April 1932)
