#### Statement of significance

The hull of the Mosquito has technical significance as an early iron brig.

#### **VHR** history

The brig Mosquito arrived in Melbourne from Hong Kong on 9 November 1878. It was laid up in Saltwater Creek (Maribyrnong River) before being sold to the South Australian Coal Company who converted it to a hulk in 1880.<br/>br /> <br /> It was towed to Melbourne by the McIlwraith, McEacharn & amp; Co.'s steamer Tagliaferre on 24 January 1897, arriving in Williamstown on 27 January (Age 28/1/1897).<br/>br /> <br /> Parsons also gives 1869 as a build date, and another date of 1847 for a Mosquito built in New Zealand, but the construction of an iron brig in New Zealand at this time is unlikely.<br /> <br /> <br /> The Register for the Mosquito stated that it was 'Towed to sea and sunk', dated 30 September 1915.<br/>br /> <br /> Cross reference with Unidentified Wreck off Point Lonsdale.
