The coastal fishing cutter Seagull became a total wreck on Gabo Island during a hard westerly gale while on a voyage from Eden to Lakes Entrance for the snapper season. The crew made it safely ashore and were looked after by the lighthouse keeper. The vessel had formerly fished out of Queenscliff under the name Priscilla, and had been fishing in the Gippsland Lakes, NSW and Bass Strait.
