

Statement of significance

The vessel is significant as a representative example of an English built barque constructed in the mid 1850s. Its archaeological significance may depend on the degree of damage incurred during the scuttling process.

VHR history

After 54 years of service, the former barque Brunette was towed out to sea and scuttled in the ship's graveyard in 1913.
